

Considerations & Criteria for Potential Candidates

Season 2023/24

Considerations:

- The award course requires a minimum of 80 hours of commitment over a season.
 - Candidates must attend all contact days and complete seven eLearning modules and accompanying tasks to agreed deadlines
 - Candidates are encouraged to engage with all aspects of the award which includes regular contact to support the development of the group dynamic
 - The course sits at Level 3 on the England Rugby Training Framework and as such requires a high degree of understanding around match officiating
- Candidates will require access to video / match footage from their own games to complete regular self-reviews.
 - Candidates must possess the ability to critically review processes and outcomes aligned to our key performance pillars. (PACT – Physical, Attitudinal, Commitment and Technical ability).
 - Candidates must be able to self-manage their learning.
 - The course requires that candidates are self-directed in their approach to learning and are driven to develop.

Please note: Not every candidate who has participated in the award has successfully completed it. The award is challenging and requires a real desire to improve your match officiating.

Criteria:

- Applicants are expected to have/be:
 - o Completed England Rugby Referee Award qualification (or equivalent)
 - Completed RFU Headcase online concussion awareness within the last 12 months
 - o Attended one match official CPD meeting / event in the previous 12 months
 - o A valid DBS certificate (this DBS clearance must be approved by the RFU)
 - Actively officiating for the 2023/24 season (you will be reviewed against games at your current level)
 - o 18 years of age or older. (As of September 1st, 2023)

- A 20-minute video showing your officiating
- Your Rugby CV
- Your Individual Rugby Development Plan (IDP)
